- Organizational chart and processes: -
Executive Director is the Head of the institution. All academic and administrative activities of the Institute are looked after by the Dean, Assistant Director, Registrar and faculty members as task heads (Chairperson). The Officer, Librarian, System Administrator are assigned with general and other administrative works.

Faculty Council comprising of the Executive Director, Dean, Assistant Director, Registrar, HOD and all the faculty members performs the day-to-day academic activities for the Institution.
Students Affairs Council (SAC) is managed by the students under the guidance of the faculty members. The SAC works as an interface between the students and the institute and the Institute, it organizes various extra-curricular activities for the overall development of students as professionals.

Academic works are assigned to faculty members and designated as Chairpersons to discharge academic duties. Officers are made in charges of various cells to discharge various administrative works.
